Catskill Hudson Area Health Education Center to Host LGBT Seminar

Catskill Hudson Area Health Education Center (AHEC) will conduct a Health Profession Seminar: *Improving Healthcare for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Individuals* on Sunday, April 3rd, at Touro College of Osteopathic Medicine in Middletown, NY. The seminar will provide an historical overview and current challenges of LGBT healthcare, a review of cultural competency in transgender care, and consideration of self-awareness of healthcare practice towards the LGBT community.

The program will provide an educational forum covering topics relevant to the LGBT patient population; to increase the knowledge-base of healthcare providers and support-staff caring for LGBT patients; and to encourage adoption of LGBT culture-friendly practices throughout the healthcare community. The intended audience for this program is physicians, nurses, social workers and all other healthcare professionals (clinical or non-clinical) who provide health-related services to the LGBT patient population. Topics will relate to both healthcare services as well as the patient care experience.

Many lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) individuals are at an increased risk for a number of health issues while facing treatment barriers compared to their heterosexual peers. LGBT people are members of every community and socioeconomic group. Consideration of their healthcare needs should be addressed to eliminate healthcare disparities and improve health-related outcomes for this patient population.
